STANDING ORDER

Section 3583(e)(l) of Title 18 U.S.C., allows for early termination of a supervised release term ("SRT"). In this District, USPOs and defendants regularly petition the court for early termination or discharge of individuals under supervision. Each party appears to follow its own format. At times, petitions lack sufficient information. The court then finds itself in need to go back and search within the case docket or case record to find information that will enable a reasoned and balanced ruling. In this light, in all future petitions for early termination to be filed before the undersigned, to enable proper evaluation the parties shall provide the following information:

I. PETITIONING PARTY

A. Case Background

- Number and summary of charges originally filed against defendant, including the charges of conviction.
- 2. Defendant's role.
- 3. Sentence imposed (original term and any subsequent modification to the judgment, this to include if an upward or downward departure was allocated at sentencing; defendant's criminal history category, term of SRT,

restitution imposed and if applicable, whether compliance with community

service has been achieved.

- 4. Term of imprisonment served.
- 5. Date in which SRT commenced.
- 6. Whether any restitution imposed and/or monetary assessment fee ("MAF") has been paid.

B. Recidivism

- 1. Provide the Post-Conviction Risk Assessment ("PCRA") including the current revocation rate for the District.
- 2. Current level of supervision and since when, on such level.

C. Defendant's Characteristics

- Personal: age, employment, vocational training, health, use of drugs (period in which drug free).
- 2. Family factors: family unit, support.
- 3. Specific achievements during supervision.
- 4. Any other information deemed relevant regarding current adjustments highlighting releasee's rehabilitation efforts and achievements.

D. Legal Support

1. Supporting authorities.

II. GOVERNMENT

The Government shall respond, indicating whether it agrees with the request for early termination. Should it oppose the request, the Government shall specifically address, in addition to the relevant grounds identified and analysis provided in support of the petition, the applicable standard of review and authorities, including caselaw arising out of identical or analogous factual settings, justifying the opposition to the early termination of SRT.
