## Public Notice Reappointment of Incumbent United States Magistrate Judge Marshal D. Morgan

The current term of office of United States Magistrate Judge Marshal D. Morgan at the District of Puerto Rico, is due to expire on May 22, 2026. The United States District Court for the District of Puerto Rico is required by law to appoint a panel of citizens to consider the reappointment of the Magistrate Judge to a new eight-year term.

The duties of a magistrate judge in this court include the following: (1) conduct most preliminary proceedings in criminal cases; (2) trial and disposition of misdemeanor cases; (3) conduct various pretrial matters and evidentiary proceedings on delegation from a district judge; (4) trial and disposition of civil cases upon consent of the litigants; and all those duties assigned in Rule 72 of the Local Rules of the Court.
